That is what our last module of EEGBI was! But at the same time one of the most challenging. We had 12 students. Most



of these men were the most faithful and fervent we have ever had. God really blessed. The challenge we experienced was the weather. This was the worst winter weather in the 17 years I have been working here. Some say it was the worst they can ever remember. Many days we were without electricity, heat and water. In some places the snow was over a meter high and with temperatures well below zero for many days. The roads were so bad that I skidded off the highway and rolled over twice. Thank God I walked away without even a scratch. Satan was so angry that I believe he attempted to take my life. *Pray about the repair or total replacement of the vehicle.* I praise the Lord and want to thank all who participated. I praise the Lord for the students. Many made huge sacrifices to be present for every class. They would return home on the week end only to find that their water pipes were frozen and no time to repair them as they had to be in class the next day. Marinel was told by his employer that if he missed 2 weeks he would have to turn in his resignation. When he went to do so, his supervisor said she would not accept it and gave him one week off with pay and the 2nd without. I want to thank Missionary Jim Pranger from Budapest. Jim and I go back to our days at Cleveland Baptist when he helped us teach hymns to our Gypsies in our ministry there. I also want to praise the Lord for Pastor Hal Nichols from S. Carolina. This is his second time teaching. He loves our Rroma and our Rroma love him. Last but not least our faithful Pastor Ghitsa and translator Mirci Pricop. One of the highlights was the last day when Costel stood and testified that he was leaving the Pentecostal movement and was ready to identify with Independent Baptists. He will be baptised on Easter.

DOLLY'S TREATMENTS BEGIN

By the time you receive this update I will be in the U S, on 2/22 Dolly began her radiation therapy. The doctors informed us that Dolly will not need treatment in her left lung. Thank you Jesus! Pray that Dolly will be healed and that she will be able to return to Hungary and Romania with me on April 4.

NEW CHURCH PLANT IN DUMBRAVA, RO

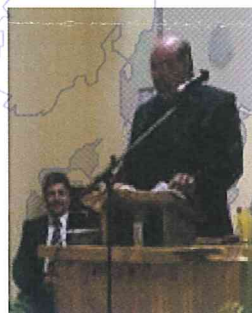
Mike and Sarah were recently with us. Mike preached in Dumbrava and gave his salvation testimony in Tasad. Sarah
